Atchafalya Bayou

LOCATION: Approximately 4 miles south of Belzoni, MS, on Hwy. 49W, west of the Yazoo River.

SIZE: 350 acres.

DEPTH: Varies from 8 to 10 feet.

AQUATIC VEGETATION: None.

MAJOR SPORTFISH: Largemouth bass, bream (bluegill), channel catfish.

OTHER FISH: Bowfin, buffalo, common carp, drum, flathead catfish, green sunfish, gar.

FISH FORAGE: Shad, minnows, sunfish.

ACCESS: The lake has one boat ramp located on the eastern bank accessible from the Yazoo River Levee.

DESCRIPTION: Atchafalya Bayou is an oxbow created by the once meandering Yazoo River. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is managing this lake for trophy bass and has imposed a 20 inch length limit with a two bass per day harvest restriction. Several years ago largemouth bass in this lake were surveyed and some weighed as much as ten pounds.
